

Dog Obedience Training

The 4H K9 Crew is cooperating with Pleasant Hill Park & Recreation to provide dog obedience training for participants 4th grade to 12th grade. 4H Club is a youth program supported through the ISU Extension service that teaches goals, record keeping, and learning by doing. Participants will learn dog care, good neighbor policies and obedience. Schedules consist of eighteen training sessions each spring. Enrollment in the Dog Obedience Training Project requires a nominal fee for 4H Membership and course registration. Participants can culminate their skills by competing at the Polk County Fair in July at the Iowa State Fairgrounds.
